

Risk of Harm Evaluation-Action Matrix

<u>Risk Level</u>	<u>Criteria</u>	<u>BIT/CARE Actions</u>	<u>Clinical Responses</u>
Low	Risk factors consistent w/ general population	+ Offer services to reduce distress + Passive monitoring	- Provide voluntary services - - Triage priority based on available resources
Elevated	Elevated risk factors No reasonably foreseeable harm to self or others	+ Refer to treatment + Release of info to track (conduct) policy compliance + Set reevaluation timeline	+ Seek release of information + Thorough assessment including mental status
High	Indications of plans or intent to harm self or others with access to means and no specific target or timeline	+ Involve key stakeholders to share and mitigate risk + Clarify criteria for risk reduction or elevation + Proactive steps to reduce risk of harm to others including means restriction and/or separating individual from the community	+ Consult openly with other providers on and off campus + Document access to means + Repeated evaluation of impulsivity risk and harm to self/others ideation tracking + Rule-out involuntary hold + Clear protocols for treatment non-compliance
Imminent	Harm is more likely than not without time sensitive intervention	+ Contact Law Enforcement + Reduce risk of harm to others including notification or emergency alerts	+Contact law enforcement +Warn others +Voluntary or involuntary mental hygiene hold
